As introduced in previous years, there are four levels of categories with point requirements for each Award level. Award compensation is as follows: \$500 for Platinum, \$350 for Gold, \$250 for Silver, and \$150 for Bronze.


# How to Complete the 2020 Lodge Recognition Program Forms



## 2020 CSA Fraternal Life Lodge Recognition Program

The Lodge Recognition Program was created to motivate the lodges of CSA Fraternal Life and to recognize them for their efforts to exhibit Equality, Harmony, and Fraternity to both our members and our communities. Awards for this program are granted to lodges that are well rounded and meet criteria in four areas:

- 1. **Service/Volunteer Hours/Donations** Serving our communities is what we do. This area measures lodges by how they activate members to improve the communities around them.
- Lodge Activities/Attendance Our organization consists of a nationwide network of lodges. We maintain our bond by engaging in activities that unite our members on a local and national level. Our activities keep our society strong while honoring our lodge system and Fraternal programs.
- 3. **Social Engagement/Traditions/Rituals** Social activity is what keeps our members together. In addition, CSA's fraternal history consists of various traditions and rituals that make up the backbone of this Society.
- 4. Lodge Reporting (Sound Operations) The strongest lodges are the ones that meet regularly, maintain best business practices and operate consistent with the CSA Home Office and Fraternal Department.

### **NOTE:** Required points have to be earned in each of these four categories to win an award.

Lodges with a healthy balance of the above criteria will be rewarded: Platinum, Gold, Silver, or Bronze.

**Important:** Please keep in mind that one point does not equal one option. You may select a single option that can be as little as one point or as much as four points. For example, trying to earn a Platinum Award does not mean you have to choose 60 options, rather you have to **earn** 60 total points.

- To earn the **Platinum Award** (\$500 Award) designation, a lodge is required to earn sixty four (64) points or more from the four categories plus hold **10 lodge meetings** and donate **25% of your annual allotment to charity**.
- To earn the Gold Award (\$350 Award) designation a lodge is required to earn forty-eight (48) points or more from the four categories plus hold 9 lodge meetings and donate 25% of your annual allotment to charity.
- To earn the Silver Award (\$250 Award) designation a lodge is required to earn forty (40) points or more from the four categories plus hold 8 lodge meetings and donate 25% of your annual allotment to charity.
- To earn the **Bronze Award** (\$150 Award) designation a lodge is required to earn thirty-two (32) points or more from the four categories plus hold 6 lodge meetings and donate 25% of your annual allotment to charity.



### I. Service Activities/Volunteer Hours/Donations

- 1. 2 points Lodge coordinates or participates in an official Join Hands Day activity.
  - Minimum of 2 members must participate.
  - Maximum is 2 points, 1 Join Hands Day activity.
- 2. 2 points Lodge participates in "CSA Serves".
  - Must provide service hours and donations.
  - Donations must be at least 25% of annual allocation <u>and</u> lodge must perform a minimum of 25 volunteer hours over the year. Donations can be made over a year's time. 25 volunteer hours can be for one or more causes.
  - Minimum of 2 members must participate. Points will be awarded even if lodge members volunteer alone at the same project but at a different time. All hours will count towards the 25 hour minimum.
  - Maximum is 2 points.
- 3. 3 points Lodge provides transportation to at least three (3) meetings for lodge member(s).
  - Can be 1 or more drivers for 1 or more members.
  - A CSA member driving another member who is their family member/spouse will still receive points.
  - Maximum is 3 points.
- 4. 1 point per Lodge member(s) participating in the Get-Together Service Project.
  - May attend event, donate money, or donate goods to the Service Project.
  - Maximum is 3 points, i.e., 3 members attend or donate.
- 5. 2 points Lodge holds a fundraiser and raises \$100 for a charitable organization (other than CSA Fraternal Life).
  - This total can be accumulated throughout the year.
  - Maximum is 4 points, i.e., lodge raises \$200 for a charitable organization.
- 6. 3 points Lodge donates handmade or purchased items to a hospital, center, shelter, etc.
  - Items include blankets, hats, gloves, scarves, etc.
    - Maximum is 3 points, i.e., 1 donation.
- 7. 1 point Lodge donates minimum \$50 to Emergency or Disaster Relief fund.
  - Organizations include Red Cross, FEMA, Salvation Army, etc.
  - Maximum is 2 points, i.e., 2 donations.
- 8. 1 point Lodge sends medicine bottles, stamps, buttons, box tops, pop tops, etc. to charity, Home Office, or other lodge.
  - Maximum is 3 points, i.e., 3 donations.
- 9. 2 points For every \$50 donation to CSA Scholarship Fund by Lodge.
  - Maximum is 4 points, i.e., \$100 donation.

### II. Lodge Activities/Attendance

- 1. 2 points Lodge creates a display on Czech or Slovak heritage/culture and shows it at a library, school, church, lodge meeting place, etc.
  - Minimum of 2 members must participate.
  - Maximum is 4 points, i.e., 2 displays.
- 2. 2 points Members of your lodge attend another lodge's meeting, social event, or volunteer activity.
  - May be a virtual meeting Skype, FaceTime, video chat, etc.
  - Minimum of 2 members must participate.
  - Maximum is 4 points, i.e., 2 meetings attended.
- 3. 2 points Members of another lodge attend your lodge's meeting, social event, or volunteer activity.
  - May be a virtual meeting Skype, FaceTime, video chat, etc.
  - Minimum of 2 members must participate.
  - Maximum is 4 points, i.e., 2 meetings attended.
- 4. 2 points 1 youth member attends 3 meetings throughout the year.
  - Maximum is 4 points, i.e., 2 youth members attend 3 meetings throughout the year.
- 5. 3 points Lodge "reactivates" 1 member who attends a minimum of 2 meetings.
  - Reactivate = Member who has not attended a meeting in 12 months.
  - Maximum is 6 points, i.e., 2 reactivated members.
- 6. 2 points Members attend, volunteer, work, or coach at a community event.
  - Includes: church event, sports game, pancake breakfast, spaghetti dinner, Fraternal Society event (CSA or non-CSA related), ethnic event, etc.
  - Minimum of 2 members must participate.
  - Maximum is 4 points, i.e., 2 events.
- 7. 2 points Per lodge member attending CSA Annual Bowling Congress.
  - Maximum is 4 points, i.e., 2 lodge members attending.
- 8. 2 point Per lodge member attending Annual Get-Together.
  - Maximum is 4 points, i.e., 2 lodge members attending.
- 9. 1 point Per youth member participating in CSA Jr. Bowl-o-Rama.
  - Youth can bowl with Lodge, District, or independently.
  - Maximum is 4 points, i.e., 4 youth members participating.
- 10. 1 point Per submission by lodge member(s) for Photo Contest.
  - Maximum is 4 points, i.e., 4 members submitting photos.

#### **III.** <u>Social Engagement/Traditions/Rituals</u>

- 1. 3 points Lodge hosts social activity (movie night, craft night, etc.)
  - Minimum of 4 members must participate.
  - Maximum is 3 points.
- 2. 2 points Lodge members attend a social outing (play, holiday party, bus trip, etc.)
  - Minimum of 4 members must participate.
  - Maximum is 4 points, i.e., 2 outings.
- 3. 2 points Lodge members hold a competition at a regular lodge meeting, vote for a winner, and give an award or small monetary prize.
  - Competition can include Yahtzee, seek & find, crossword puzzle, etc.
  - Minimum of 4 members must participate.
  - Maximum is 2 points, i.e., 1 competition.
- 4. 2 points Lodge members research and give a report or presentation on Czech or Slovak culture, traditions, etc.
  - Minimum of 4 members must be in attendance.
  - Maximum is 2 points, i.e., 1 report or presentation.
- 5. 2 points Conduct a Baby or Youth Naming Ceremony.
  - Naming member can be up to 12 years old.
  - Minimum of 4 members must be in attendance.
  - Maximum is 2 points, i.e., 1 Baby or Youth Naming Ceremony.
- 6. 2 points Conduct a formal Installation of Officers.
  - Minimum of 4 members must be in attendance.
  - Maximum is 2 points, i.e., 1 formal Installation of Officers.
- 7. 2 points Conduct a Memorial Service for deceased members.
  - Minimum of 4 members must be in attendance.
  - Maximum is 2 points, i.e., 1 Memorial Service.
- 8. 2 points Conduct a Memorial or Funeral Service for a recently deceased member.
  - Minimum of 4 members must be in attendance.
  - Maximum is 2 points, i.e., 1 Memorial or Funeral Service.
- 9. 3 points Lodge invites an outside speaker to lecture or give presentation on topic of interest to lodge members.
  - Minimum of 4 members must be in attendance.
  - Maximum is 3 points, i.e., 1 lecture or presentation.
- 10. 2 points Lodge hosts or attends 50-year or 75-year Pin Party (may occur at lodge meeting).
  - Minimum of 4 members must participate.
  - Maximum is 2 points, i.e., 1 Pin Party.
- 11. 3 points Lodge submits a nominee for CSA Fraternalist of the Year
  - Maximum is 3 points, i.e., 1 nominee for CSA Fraternalist of the Year.
- 12. 2 points Lodge member runs for Miss National CSA
  - Maximum is 4 points, i.e., 2 members run for Miss National CSA.
- 13. 1 point Youth member participates in Princess program during Miss National CSA Contest.
  - Maximum is 1 point, i.e., 1 Princess participating.

\*\* These options are REQUIRED to win ANY award.

- 1. \*\* 3 points Annual 2020 Lodge Election Report sent to Home Office by December 31, 2020.
- 2. \*\* 3 points Annual 2019 Financial Report submitted to Home Office by March 31, 2020.
- 3. 1 BONUS point Annual 2019 Financial Report submitted to Home Office by February 28, 2020.
- 4. 3 points Lodge submits minimum 6 Lodge President's Reports by December 31, 2020.
- 5. 4 points Lodge submits minimum 6 Journal articles with a photo during the year.
  - Additional photos do not count for additional points.
  - Maximum is 4 points, i.e., 6 Journal articles with a photo during the year.
- 6. 2 points Lodge sends 2 brief articles and photos to Fraternal Department for Facebook post.
  Maximum is 2 points, i.e., 2 brief articles and photos.
- 2 points Lodge sends 1 member's email contact to Home Office.
  - Maximum is 4 points, i.e., 2 members' email contact.
- 8. 4 points Lodge prepares mailing and sends to members to promote attendance at meetings, social event, encourage women to participate in the Miss National CSA Contest, etc.
  - Home Office will assist with member lists and blank envelopes.
  - Maximum is 8 points, i.e., 2 mailings.
